**The Gift of Prayer**

*To be told you have cancer can be frightening but with modern medicine, the fear is not as severe as in previous times. Since being diagnosed with cancer, I have met many patients in hospital and people in convalescent homes who are recovering from operations to remove cancerous tumours. What I noticed about all these people was their faith in God. It was something we all had in common—we prayed.*

*While in a convalescent home, I had a conversation with another lady in which we both exchanged details of our operations. I had explained that my cancer had been removed completely and there was no further treatment required. Her response was "The Lord has more work for you to do". Even though I have the faith myself, I was surprised at her quick response and her open admission of her faith. This lady was due to have chemotherapy.*

*Prayer is powerful but I call it a gift as so many people nowadays (young and old) do not seem to pray and, frankly, they are missing out! I am glad that I have the gift of prayer and I would like to think that others will also be blessed with this gift.*

*To this day, I say my morning prayers—sometimes in bed, sometimes at breakfast, sometimes on the drive to work. I offer up my efforts during the day for someone/anyone. When I put my head on the pillow at night, I pray for myself and my family.*

*To turn to God in times of trouble is a great consolation but to have Him with you always is a wonderful way to live your life.*

Every diocese and religious order organises Vocation Days to help people to discern their calling. A vocation to priesthood is a grace given to an individual for the service of the church-community. Basic requirements of a genuine vocation to priesthood would include a desire to commit one's life to God and the service of people, a sound faith, regular Mass attendance and prayer, the ability to co-operate with others and being willing to obey authority.
