After Christmas I met Fr John Hughes, who is the Vicar for Priests in the Diocese to discuss my future. I asked that in the Summer changes, I would be allowed to stay in the Parish and serve St Agnes as long as I had the health and the energy. I made one extra request that I would have a three month break before resuming ministry in the Parish. This request was granted by the Archbishop in my letter of appointment as a Team Assistant working as needed in the three parishes of Crumlin, Clogher Road, and Mourne Road, "until my 80th Birthday"

I found the rest period away most refreshing and feel rested and revived by the experience. The time away allowed me to do a number of things which time and space in the past prevented me from doing.

It is good to be back in Crumlin again from the 1st December. I am happy to be among familiar faces and friends. I know that my three month absence placed an extra burden on my fellow priests, so I am sure they welcome my return.

I am reminded of the fragility of life at my age as three of my classmates have died in the past year. Two of them were active Parish Priests and the third man although retired was in reasonable health before a short illness claimed his life. May they rest in peace.

At our age we must all be ready when the Lord comes knocking on the door. I am thinking positive however. In May last I celebrated my Golden Jubilee of my Ordination. I am now looking forward to my Diamond Jubilee with the help of God.
