Why do we say that we are waiting for someone who has Already Come?

Advent uncovers our neediness and stirs in us that great hunger for God
which lies deep in the heart of each one. It is a hidden hunger. Under all
our other hungers-hunger for power, for fame, for all the comforting things
we cannot live without - the television, computers, games, fashion and so
on, is this deep hunger for God. The raw pangs of God-hunger can unsettle
all these other hungers and expose their transient nature. What a grace this
is! How blessed are we when we come to understand that it is God we truly
long for and that without this relationship we will never be fully happy.
Advent can be a problem. If Jesus is already with us, in us, all around us,
what does it mean to say we are waiting for Him to come? How can I wait
for someone who is already here?

Of course Jesus is here but the question to ask yourself is, how alive is He -
for you?

If Christ is within you, how much room does He take up in your life? If He is
simply someone you nod to now and then, someone you try to meet on
Sundays, someone who for the most part does not figure in your day to day
living, then His birth in you is long overdue.

In some way, we are surely called to be gifts to others during this season
leading up to Christmas. When I go out of myself, offer myself in love and
service to others, especially to those who are unloved and unwanted, poor
and lost, then Christ comes alive in me. Amazingly, I get a life only when I
give it away. This is at the heart of Christ's message to all of us. Time is
short; if you have not already begun, start to-day to energise your waiting,
to really stir up that longing for God which is deep in you even though it may
be hidden by the dust of years. Reach out and respond to those in particular
need this Christmas. Then the song will rise from your heart, the song of
Isaiah, the song of Mary, the song of those who longed for the coming of
Jesus in their lives—"O come, O come, Emmanuel!"
