Thought for the Week

ST. STEPHEN, MARTYR.

St. Stephen, the first martyr, began his Christian ministry by waiting on tables [acts 6; 2-3]. His committed service to Christ albeit a humble and ordinary task, led him down a Path that was to end in him laying down his life for Christ as a martyr.

Our word 'martyr' comes from the Greek word for a 'witness'. St. Stephen was first and foremost a witness. Indeed, it was his ability to give eloquent and convincing witness to his faith in Christ that resulted in his death. Luke reports that St. Stephen was hated and loathed specifically by members of the Synagogue of the Freedmen. This hatred and loathing must have intensified when, while attempting to engage him in debate, they simply could not stand up to his wisdom and clarity.

Last year Cardinal Cormac Murphy O'Connor was invited to edit the Radio 4 flagship news programme PM. One of the things he said whilst on air was that in his view Britain is an unfriendly place for religious people to live. He believes that the rise of secularism has led to a liberal society hostile to Christianity and its values, in which religious beliefs is viewed as a private eccentricity and the voice of faith groups is marginalised. "Is Ireland moving in the same direction?"

If truth be told, giving witness to Christ has invited trouble and persecution in every age. To take a stand and be a witness will by definition require us to step out in faith and be prepared to suffer rejection and hostility. We cannot do this in and by our own strength. We need help and grace to be witnesses but Jesus has promised us every help and every grace.

In the face of a society that is becoming increasingly secular and hostile to faith, especially Christian faith, how are we to respond? We need to imitate St. Stephen taking heart from his witness and his courage.

'Lord, give me courage to witness for you, strength to resist anger or hostility and a love for you that will burn in my heart'.
