Love in The Air

Next Thursday is St Valentines Day. Thousands of cards, tons of chocolate and acres of red roses will be exchanged all over the country as yet one more day is exploited to the full by card manufacturing companies and others. As the cash registers ring, it is hard not to feel a little bit cynical about it all. And yet behind all the hype and fuss maybe there is really something to celebrate.

In his first official letter *Deus Caritas Est, God is Love*, Pope Benedict writes about the Christian idea of love. In it he points out that we use the word love in many different ways - we speak of love of family, friends, country, love between parents and children, love of neighbour and love of God. He then goes on to suggest that the type of love that he describes as "neither planned nor willed", what we might call the 'falling in love' that is celebrated on St Valentines Day "would seem to be the very epitome of love; all other kinds of love immediately seem to fade in comparison".

And it is true that for many people the experience of falling in love, and the feeling of being loved by another, is a very vivid and often defining experience in their lives. It opens them up to the challenges and risks of being in a relationship with another person. As Pope Benedict points out it is also a relationship which if it is to grow involves understanding, generosity and a willingness to make another person the centre of one's concern. We need, as it were to be able to move beyond the St Valentines Day moment. In the meantime, in spite of all the hype and commercialization, we should also celebrate it and the part of the human condition it commemorates.

• **Our Lady of Lourdes** •
11th February

On 11th February 1858—150 years ago this year—Our Blessed Mother appeared to a young girl called Bernadette Soubirous. Bernadette was collecting firewood by the River Gave outside Lourdes when she saw a mysterious beautiful woman in a grotto. Over a period of time she saw the same apparition on eighteen different occasions. On the third occasion she began to speak with Bernadette and asked her to pray for the conversion of sinners, to wash in the spring water nearby, and to tell the priests that they must build a special chapel on that spot. Bernadette asked her various times who she was and at last she replied "I am the Immaculate Conception".

Initially nobody would believe Bernadette and she suffered greatly because of the apparitions. But gradually word spread and Lourdes has since become the most famous shrine to Our Lady in the world. Many sick have also been healed there.
