The Communion in Between!

A little girl in a white veil approaches in procession for her first Holy Communion. There have been big events in her life—birthdays, Santa Claus, but this Holy Communion is the climax of her young life. Her eyes are focussed on the Host. She receives it on the palm and passes it with reverence to her mouth, God is with her now.

An old woman waits on her deathbed for her last Holy Communion. There have been big events in her life - her wedding, her first child, the first time she was called 'Nannie'. Now with her last Holy Communion, comes the climax of old age. God is with her now, as she will be with Him for all eternity.

The first Holy Communion is always a fervent one. So is the last. We bring to the first the freshness of youth; we bring to the last the awful clarity that age brings to life! What about the Communion in between? How do we approach them?

Firstly in Holy Communion, Our Lord nourishes us. He gives us food for our souls. What solid food does for an adult, Holy Communion does for the soul. By receiving regularly we thrive spiritually on the body and blood of Christ.

Secondly, in Holy Communion, Our Lord makes us one with Himself. The most intimate relationship we know is that of man and wife, where two people live with one another all their lives. The intimacy born of Communion is closest of all. 'Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in that person.' [Jn 6:56]

Thirdly, in Holy Communion, Our Lord makes us one with each other. It's not purely a love-affair between Our Lord and yourself but a love-affair that embraces the whole community. Not just my Communion with Christ, but our Communion with each other in Christ. It's not just a personal sacrament. It's a social sacrament too, a circle that includes yourself, Christ and all your neighbours. Pray for Parish Community, that it will grow ever more united as one family in Christ.

Booking Masses.

As there is uncertainty about our future staff levels we await the Diocesan Changes which we expect in mid July. In the meantime Sunday Mass bookings for January next, which open usually on July 1st will not now begin until August 1st. By that time we will know how many priests we will have from Autumn onwards. It is very likely we will be reducing the amount of Masses on Sunday mornings from January 2012. This will also mean a change in Mass times. However it is our intention to continue with the present Mass arrangements until the end of this year, with the exception of July and August as already testified to you elsewhere in this Newsletter.
