Our Journey to Rome.

It is a very long time since any baby was baptised with the name of Agnes here in our Parish. I wonder did any girl take her name for Confirmation this year? I doubt it. As a saint she should be a model for young people as she is believed to have been martyred at the age when young people receive the Sacrament today. St. Agnes is the Patron Saint of young girls and engaged couples. St. Agnes was chosen as the Patron Saint of our first Church in Post Penal Times when the old building was opened in 1726.

This year as you know we are celebrating the 75th Anniversary of the Blessing and dedication of our present Church building and our Pilgrimage to Rome will visit places associated with her martyrdom in the fourth century. On this Tuesday afternoon we will visit the Church of St. Agnes in the Piazza Navona, believed to be the site of her martyrdom. We will celebrate /mass there and remember especially the people of our Parish. On next Saturday we will travel out of the centre of Rome along the Via Nomentana to the Basilica of St. Agnes where we will visit the Catacombs underneath the Church dedicated to her honour and where she was buried and celebrate Mass in the Church where her tomb is today.

The 35 members of our group are looking forward to our Pilgrimage. We will remember and pray for you in Rome and Assisi and the places associated with our Parish Patron-St. Agnes. May Iceland keep its volcanic Ash to itself.
