Life out of Death

November is the month we associate with death. We pray for those gone before us marked with the sign of faith. Even nature reminds us of death at this time of year; as the leaves fall from the trees no longer green with life but a lifeless golden-brown. Death is a part of our human experience. We experience death on so many different levels throughout our lives. As Christians death is always followed by resurrection. Death is never the end but the beginning of something new. Having said that, death is never easy in whatever form we experience it. The death of a loved one, the death of a loving relationship, the death of ones hopes and dreams.

The model of Church that most of us have known is dying. This is not something to be alarmed about because the Holy Spirit is always leading and guiding the Church. With fewer people following the Lord in the religious life, be it as priests, brothers or sisters, the Church must adapt to the times it finds itself in. As Proverbs 29: 18 says, "When there is no vision the people perish" and so we see new ways of ministering to God's people beginning to develop. With team ministry, parish pastoral workers, permanent deacons etc., change is never easy for anyone and as the old model of Church dies out there is the light of resurrection, a new dawn; a fresh approach to how we live and proclaim the Gospel as the people of God.
