St Agnes Parish Update

It is important that we, the priests of the Parish, communicate with you on a regular basis so that you are kept well informed of parish life and of plans and ideas that are being developed on your behalf by the Parish Pastoral Council in conjunction with the priests.

In an earlier contribution to the Newsletter, we set out in detail the changes in Mass times that will come into effect in January 2012, when we will have fewer masses in our parish Church. I would like to reassure you however, that while the number of masses will be reduced, the quality of our liturgy will not. Various meetings of all those involved in ministry will take place over the coming weeks. We want to thank you for your co-operation and for your willingness to accept the circumstances in which it became necessary to make these changes.

Looking ahead to 2012 the Parish Pastoral Council has identified as a priority, the complete internal refurbishment of the Church. So much has already been done—repairs to the roof, the refurbishment of the beautiful stained glass windows, the building of the Parish Centre. The Parish Pastoral Council and the priests now wish to apply their energies to the completion of this task of internal refurbishment, which will have as its goal the enhancement of the beauty and dignity of St Agnes which we can hand on to future generations of faithful catholic people.

Mechanisms will be put in place early in 2012 with a view to completing the refurbishment of the Church within a year to eighteen months. We will keep you fully informed of developments as the plans progress.

As we approach the Advent season, I pray that each of us can open our hearts to a new coming of Christ in our lives, in our families and in our parish.
