## From Boom to Bust

I am sure you are tired of hearing discussions on the sorry mess we are in. May I add my pennysworth to the mountains of words spoken and written.

We all know the causes-greed and corruption. Many ordinary folk joined in the search for a larger slice of the cake. Politicians of all shades and parties were calling for more and more expenditure as if the good days would never end. But they have. We are now in a crisis situation as we face a tough budget in ten days time. The IMF and the European Central Bank are in town and we fear the harsh medicine they may prescribe for a bailout of our banks and our ailing economy.

At the end of August, THE TABLET, The International Catholic Weekly, had a Leading Article after the emergency Budget was introduced in the U.K. The Institute of Fiscal Studies in England is quoted, 'The-Institute calculates that due to benefit cuts, and tax rises announced in the Budget, low income families with children are set to lose most as a percentage of nett income.' Here in Ireland the effect of cuts in the forthcoming Budget will effect those who most depend on benefits, and state support.

David Quinn writing in the TABLET last weekend asks 'What of the Catholic Church in all this? In the main, it is keeping its head down. Archbishop Diarmuid Martin has spoken about the need to protect the most vulnerable in society. But the sex scandals have damaged the bishops so badly they cannot speak with any real moral authority about the crisis. In a way, this is a double tragedy for Ireland because the country badly needs credible moral leadership and it does not know where to find it.'

Those who run our good 'Catholic' Schools need to ask how such schools produced so many greedy Bankers, politicians and developers who have got us into this mess. Where has Catholic Social Teaching impinged on those leaders in Irish Society?

We are a resilient people, we will recover, but we all know there are difficult days and years ahead. Let us work together to create a better although leaner Ireland.
