**Youth Taking Responsibility for Mission**

Mid August of this year 1,000 young people from Ireland went to Madrid where they joined 1.5 million other young people who came from all over the world to celebrate their faith together, and a celebration that they had with music, dancing and camaraderie between people from all nations

The theme for World Youth Day (WYD) 2011 was chosen by Pope Benedict taken from St Paul's letter to the Colossians 'planted and built up in Jesus Christ; firm in the faith'. The Scripture of WYD had 4 parts; catechesis—Days in the Dioceses, the way of the cross, a prayer vigil and a Youth Mass. These young people experiences different aspects of community—with the group they travelled with. It is with these pilgrims from home that the strongest bonds were and are still being developed

The days in the Dioceses where the youth from various parts of the globe were hosted by Spanish dioceses, introduced the international pilgrims to the host country and allowed them to bond in their common faith. The Way of the Cross, the prayer vigil where all spent the night in an aerodrome, beginning with Eucharistic Adoration in the presence of the Holy Father and concluded with a Youth Mass. Here the global Church came together to celebrate their faith, giving everyone a true sense of the global community that is the Church which has spread to the ends of the earth. At the end of the Mass the Pope addressed the young people, sending them out to the world to witness to their faith as the Lord did with the apostles.

When Pope John Paul II initiated WYD it was with a view to evangelise young people. Now that call has been transformed and the Youth are challenged to go out and evangelise their peers, as they know their friends better than anyone.

The young people who are rooted in Christ can provide a foundation for the Church in Ireland, not only in the future, but starting now. We have nothing to lose and everything to gain by inviting them to become central to the mission of our parishes. Inspired by the WYD experience they can help our parishes find their roots and build up in Christ

**Rome Update.**

Our Spirituality Course concluded at the end of September. We had twenty four priests from all over Ireland and abroad and they returned to their Parishes.

As we departed the students arrived back and in the coming year they will have twenty Seminarians and forty Post Graduate Students studying at various Universities in Rome.

The Irish College has trained Students for Ireland since Penal Times. The College was founded in 1628 by the renowned Irish Franciscan Fr. Luke Wadding and it was established particularly to train priests to send back to Ireland. The best known one is St. Oliver Plunkett. He was the martyred Archbishop of Armagh and died at Tyburn in London in 1681. Closer to own time a priest of our Diocese, Columba Marmion who was a son of shopkeepers in Queen Street studied in the college and was ordained for Dublin and served in the Parish of Dundrum. After two years he was appointed to the staff of Holy Cross College Clonliffe. He then left Ireland to become a Benedictine in the Abbey of Maredsous in Belgium. He was a very distinguished Spiritual writer who influenced many people during the twentieth century and he was declared blessed about ten years ago.

On the day of our departure the new Rector of the Irish College Fr. Ciaran O'Carroll arrived to the college. This is an important appointment for a priest from the Archdiocese of Dublin. He is a former student himself and a distinguished Church Historian. Until taking up his new appointment he was Episcopal Vicar for Evangelisation in the Diocese and administrator for University Church, St. Stephens Green. We wish him well in his new role.
