Reaching Out

The theme for this year's October's Mission month is "Reach Out". When the priest at the end of Mass commissions us with the words "Let us go and serve the Lord", it is a key starting point for the ministry of 'reaching out'. The command calls us to go forth beyond the walls of the church building and be 'salt and light' in our neighbourhoods and communities where we live and work. When we respond we are responding to our baptismal call to live out the teachings of Jesus and to transform society by expressing our love in service to others. We are all called to mission. As a Church in Ireland we must always remember that unless we are engaged with those whose needs are the greatest across the world we cannot fully share the Christian call to be missionary. Every person no matter what their status, has a role to play in spreading the Mission of the Church. Some of us go on mission, not by moving, but by being. We do it as workers, students, neighbours and parents. At an individual level mission could be as simple as visiting members of the community who are housebound and would appreciate someone to call on them. Mission can take place within the home while those raising young families can often find themselves not having the time to contribute to the parish, they might underestimate the importance of their role as parents. How they live their lives is of primary importance to the faith development of their children, and it is this mission as witness, more than any preaching or teaching, which will have the greatest impact on their children. To 'reach out' is a way to make the Gospel happen in today's world, but it is carried out with the inspiration of prayer, which give us the strength to continue to live the Christian life in the world. When we reach out, we are living out the Gospel of Jesus who tells us that in the final judgement we will be asked whether we cared for the sick, visited the lonely and sheltered the homeless. Others we remember and pray for are the Irish Missionaries, past and present, who have left our country to Evangelise and spread the Gospel, literally to the ends of the earth in places devastated by Earthquakes, Typhoons, War, HIV/aids, Oppressive Regimes and grinding poverty. The challenge for us is; let's think mission, let's support mission and let's be mission.
