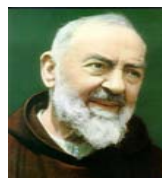

### Living the Word.

The three seminarians were discussing the relative merits of different translations of the Bible. One argued for the New Revised Standard Version. 'It's closer,' he said, 'To the original Hebrew and Greek.' Another preferred the New Jerusalem Bible; The layout made it readable and he found the notes superb. The third student said that his choice was undoubtedly his mother's translation. They looked askance at him. 'I didn't know your mother had translated the Bible,' one of them said. 'Oh yes, indeed' he replied. 'She translates it into action!' we all know people who often unknown to themselves, like that seminarian's mother, brings the Scriptures to life. Not that they go about preaching or teaching, unless that is their calling, but in their ordinary everyday lives they convey something of the unconditional all-forgiving, all accepting love of God for others.

"You are a letter of Christ, written not in ink but by the Spirit of the living God, not on tablets of stone, but on tablets that are hearts of flesh" 2 Cor. 3:3. You may be the only letter that some people read today. You are the 'good news' for them, hope for them, compassion and peace. Like that seminarian's mother, you become the best of translators. People will read, not words written on a page but the life-giving words of the heart. The closer you are to God, the clearer is your translation. Think of Fr. Damian the Leper as St. Damian of Molokai, think of St. Theresa. Think too of the neighbour who helps you with a difficult child, the stranger who stops to assist you up when you stumble in the street, the teenager who helps in a soup kitchen, the people who work for and with the homeless. 'I was hungry and you gave me to eat, thirsty...naked...etc. The theme for the month of October and especially for today Mission Sunday is 'Reach out'. The theme reminds us that we can 'reach out' from home to help our Missionaries and the people they serve; just as in their everyday work Irish Missionaries are reaching out to help those among whom they live and work. And it may be that, because you and these Missionaries someone gets a glimpse of, or hears, the Living Word of God today.
