### Seeing Your Life Through The Lens of the Gospel. Luke 19:1-10

Zacchaeus showed himself open to the call of Jesus, to the surprise of his contemporaries, who thought there was no good in tax collectors. Sometimes the people who give us lessons in goodness may be people we previously disregarded. Recall when this happened for you.

It was the eagerness of Zacchaeus to see what kind of a man Jesus was that opened him up to conversion. When you consider moments of change in your life what were the interests or desires that prepared you for change?

The decision of Jesus to eat in the house of Zacchaeus broke the social norms of his day and scandalised those who saw him. When have you found table fellowship a useful way of breaking down artificial boundaries between people.?

Q : Recently at a wedding in another Church everybody was invited to take Communion. But at a Catholic wedding the priest at the start said that only practising Catholics should receive. Isn't this rather narrow-minded and hurtful?

A: Catholic belief is that receiving the Lord in the Blessed Eucharist is the greatest privilege of our religion. The Catholic Church will not water down this doctrine and safeguards it with certain regulations: the recipient must be baptised and not in the state of mortal sin. A period of fasting is recommended as a mark of respect. By upholding these regulations we let others know how sacred the Blessed Eucharist is in our religion.

### Mass for the Faithful Departed.

On Tuesday November 2nd, All Souls Day, the 7pm Evening Mass will be celebrated for all those who have died. It will be an occasion to remember all of our loved ones and friends who have died. It will include a candle-lighting ceremony during the Mass. This Mass is not to be confused with the Annual Mass for Deceased Parishioners who have died during the past year. This Mass will be celebrated on Tuesday November 30th. @7pm. Invitations will be sent out to all families where a death took place during the year and people will be familiar with the format of this Mass from previous occasions.

### 2nd November: Norms for Indulgences at the Commemoration of All Souls.

- From 12 o'clock noon on November 1st until midnight on November 2nd, all who have confessed, received Holy Communion, and prayed for the Pope's intentions [one Our Father and Hail Mary, or any other prayer of one's choice] can gain one plenary indulgence by visiting a Church or Oratory, and there reciting one Our Father and the Apostle's Creed. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls of the departed. Confession may be made at any time within the week preceding or the week following November 1st.
- The faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain a plenary indulgence applicable to the Holy Souls on the usual conditions once per day from 1st to 8th of November. The conditions mentioned above apply also to this.
