#survival-of-the...?

At a recent seminar, the speaker told us that we are all focused on 'survival' these days. This is our unconscious default position. The clamour of life is such that more and more people wonder how they will make it through the day. I can only imagine what it is like for someone who leaves a homeless shelter in the morning wondering how he or she is going to survive and make it through the day. Or somebody who wakes up once again in a hospital ward wondering what the doctors are going to diagnose. Furthermore, I often wonder what it must be like for a migrant to put a foot into the Sahara hoping they have enough food and water for the journey. Yes, for many, survival is the default position and not just for those on the margins.

The seminar highlighted this but said 'well-being' should be our default position. To exist only to survive is demeaning to our human and even our divine task. The advance of economics, wealth and consumerism has actually displaced the time old task of 'well-being' with 'survival'.

One of the things about the hunter gatherer model that still exists in many indigenous communities is that while some were delegated with the task of survival for the community, others were delegated to look after the 'wellbeing' of the community. This wasn't as a result a strategic plan or a therapeutic intervention but simply because it was part of the natural order. In these days of Covid-19 we may limit our lives to mere survival. If you are sick in hospital this is understandable but what if you are just stuck in isolation – is it enough just to survive? Maybe we should put a bit of thought into waking up tomorrow with an eye on well-being. Well-being and not survival should be our default position. One of my favourite sociologists Zygmunt Bauman said, 'Why do I write books? Why do I think? Why should I be passionate? Because things could be different, they could be made better?'

We cannot guarantee the safety for our parishioners due to candles and statues being touched by so many people and large numbers gathering, therefore for the health and safety of everyone we have had to close the church from Wednesday 25th March 2020.

Mass will be streamed live ONLY on Sundays at 11 am

6 KEY STEPS TO HELP PREVENT CORONAVIRUS

- ◆ **STOP** shaking hands or hugging when saying hello or greeting other people
- ◆ **DISTANCE** yourself at least 2 metres (6 feet) away from other people
- ◆ **WASH** your hands well and often
- ◆ **COVER** your mouth and nose with a tissue or sleeve when coughing/sneezing and discard the tissue
- ◆ **AVOID** touching eyes, nose, mouth with unwashed hands
- ◆ **CLEAN** and disinfect frequently touches objects/surfaces
