GUIDELINES FOR CHURCH ATTENDANCE

The guidelines for attending mass in our Church allows us to have only **120** people to be present at any given mass. It is regrettable that we have to close our doors before any mass but once we have 120 present, we are obliged to close the Church doors and to reopen them half way through mass to allow for ventilation. Since we have shared remembrance masses every weekend for loved ones, it means that our maximum number of **120** may fill up quickly requiring that the doors may be closed 6/7/8 minutes before mass begins. We have asked families to limit the number whom they invite for the anniversary mass of a loved one so that we can accommodate others who wish to attend mass. All our masses are streamed-live, so it is possible to follow mass on your mobile phone sitting in your car or from home. We appreciate your co-operation and understanding at this time but we have to follow the Diocesan guidelines. My sincere thanks to all who act as stewards at our masses: their stewarding allows us to act responsibly and to ensure that everyone is safe at all times.

The 500-year old Ignatian Examen is a daily prayer of review - a short reflection back over the day, recalling events and taking note of your feelings. The purpose is to discern the ways in which God has been present to you, the times when the Holy Spirit was drawing you towards life.

Taking about 15-20 minutes, this simple, life-changing prayer has five steps: (1) Pray for light to understand and appreciate the past day. (2) Review the day in thanksgiving. (3) Review your feelings in the replay of the day. (4) Choose one of those feelings (positive or negative) and pray from it. (5) Look toward tomorrow. Crosscare COVID-19 (Coronavirus) update

Crosscare's focus has always been to serve the most vulnerable in our society. During this crisis we are working hard to ensure that the essential services we provide remain available to our service users while operating in line with Government and HSE advice to ensure that our service users and staff are protected. While some of our face to face services have had to be adapted to meet HSE requirements, as much as possible we are continuing to provide supports through other remote means including phone and web based technologies.

Homeless Services

Our Homeless Services including our residential facility for young people are open and operating normally and in line with HSE guidelines. We are working closely with the HSE, DRHE, Tusla and other government bodies, local authorities and colleagues in other similar organisations to ensure that our service users' needs are supported and our people are kept safe. Crosscare opened a new inner city 100 bed cocooning services for people who are homeless to keep them safe from the virus.

Food Services

Our Food Banks remain open to support those most in need at this difficult time and we have made changes at a local level to ensure that the health of all involved is safeguarded.

Close to 7,000 emergency food parcels have been delivered to vulnerable individuals and families as a crisis response since the pandemic began.

Our Community Cafes remain open providing takeaway services to protect the health of our teams and customers.

Our Carecall team are operating a normal service making calls daily to all our clients.

Youth Services

Youth services had to close initially and staff were redeployed to help keep the essential food and residential services running. Services are now open with a greater emphasis on on-line and telephone work and working more intensely with smaller numbers of particularly vulnerable young people.

Our Drugs and Alcohol Programme team are carrying out online sessions with their clients.

Our Voluntary Clubs team continue to link in with and support our volunteers by phone and other web-based technologies.
