SUPPORT FOR MASS COLLECTIONS

Sincere thanks to all parishioners for your generous support for all our collections at masses every weekend. Archbishop Farrell expresses his gratitude again to all parishes who are supportive of the Common Fund and Share Collections every week. The Common Fund is for the salaries of the priests of the Diocese, including sick and retired priests and those in special ministry. The Share Collection is primarily for the poorer parishes and for the support of pastoral initiatives in our Diocese, including management of various caring agencies. Since the pandemic of March 2020, funds have decreased for these collections but parishioners are responding very generously in giving extra every week. We have now installed a facility for **DIGITAL GIVING**. Machines have been installed at the inside entrance of the Church for any person to make a donation of your choice. The instructions on how to use this facility are over the machine. Sometimes people come to Church without cash and often ask if we have a **Tap and Go** facility. This facility will enable anyone to make a contribution to the Diocese for the support of the Common Fund and Share Collections. Thank you again for all your financial support. *Fr. Tony*

ST PIO RELIC (1st Class)

A brief note on the relic used for the blessing after the monthly Padre Pio (St Pio) Mass (3rd Tuesday of each month 7.00pm)

This relic was presented to the late Rev Fr. Michael Duggan C.S.S.P. by Monsignor Geraldo di Flumeri Vice Postulate for the canonisation of Padre Pio. Within the reliquary is a piece of congealed skin and blood from the wound of St Pio.

When Fr. Michael revived the Padre Pio prayer group in Drimnagh 2008 "Our Lady of Good Council", the relic was given to the care of group leader, Mr. Michael Keane. Michael worked with the relic visiting hospitals and attending various Padre Pio Mass groups over the years. He also supported the charities of St. Pio.

Recently the relic was passed to the care of Geoff Coughlan and while graciously considered a privilege, Geoff felt with the approval of the Keane and Duggan families, it would benefit the people to present the relic to the Church, where it would ensure its use for future continual blessing.

With the intention of Fr. Tony the relic will be given a permanent position within the church when a secure and suitable place is found. This will be simply for the benefit of the people as these relics are intended.

The St Pio prayer group here in St. Agnes' Church was formed with the approval of Fr. John Deasy in November 2003, Fr. John along with Fr. Michael and Fr. David Fleming concelebrated the first Mass. Fr. Michael also concelebrated with Fr. John for the tenth anniversary.

Fr. Michael assisted Fr. Tony when Fr. Tony formed the Monkstown prayer group early 2000 "St. Patrick's". A number of our members will also remember Fr. Michael as spiritual director and co-ordinator for the prayer groups for almost 50 years closing with the words of St. Pio.

"Always stay close to the Catholic Church, because it alone can give you true peace, because it alone possesses Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament who is the true Prince of Peace" Padre Pio.

A sincere thanks to Fr. Tony, Fr. John, Fr. Tom, Karen and Marie (Byrne) for their continuous support, and most important thanks to the members of the group who make it possible for the continuity of the group. **Geoff Coughlan**
