#### **BUILDING HOPE**

Parishes are already engaged in much discerning through their Pastoral Councils and Finance Teams how best to utilise all resources so that we make our parishes welcoming, hospitable, truly caring and compassionate for all but especially for those who are often left out and who are in great need. Our Pastoral Council is preparing a meeting for Parishioners – much the same format as the Synodal Pathway meeting before Easter – so that we can reflect on the ways we can renew our own Parish of St. Agnes. When we have the meeting prepared we will be inviting parishioners once again to come along and share ideas, suggestions and perhaps volunteer for involvement in some way. Much good is already happening in our Parish through the generosity of so many people but it's only when we reflect prayerfully together can we truly recognise that we may need to do more for the good of our parish.
