THANK YOU

The Parish Finance Committee expresses thanks to all who contribute to the upkeep of our Church and Parish through direct debit, weekly envelope or through a once off contribution. The amount collected through the Family Envelope Fund is printed in the Newsletter every week. (This does not include the other two ways of contributing). Our Parish Finance Secretary, Bernadette has completed the finance audit for the outgoing year to the end of 2021. She has also finalised the listing of all donations given for the past 4 years through the means mentioned above but also through the **Christmas, Easter and Summer Dues**. The donations of many parishioners has gone over **€250**. This means we can, as a charity, claim tax back on all such donations over **€250**. Some parishioners will already have signed a certificate giving us their permission to claim this tax relief, your certificate being valid for five years. Some parishioners may have received correspondence recently to ask you to sign the certificate so that we can claim the tax relief on your donation. This will cost you nothing financially but is an extra source of income for the parish funds. We appreciate your co-operation with this matter. Our sincere thanks again for all your financial support and we are grateful for your generosity in these times. Lighting a Candle.

When you light a candle, it continues to burn after you leave the church. In this way the lighted candle continues in a prayer on your behalf. We wish to highlight the importance of safety. Children are not allowed to light a candle unless under the direct supervision of a parent or guardian. This is an important health and safety issue. If you see a child lighting a candle without supervision, you should intervene and tell the child not to do so. Please do so in a kindly fashion. Also as you have sanitised your hands upon entering the church, please be mindful that the Hand Sanitiser contains a small percentage of alcohol which is flammable, so please ensure your hands are dry. Do not touch statues, just bless yourself and bow before them. Please take care.

Seeing your Life through the Lens of the Gospel 25th Sept 2022 - 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time & World Day of Migrants and Refugees

- 1) The first of the faults attributed to the rich man is his insensitivity to the abject poverty of those around him. When have you discovered that it is when you are aware of the needs of those around you and seek to make some response that you bring out the best in yourself?
- 2) The second fault attributed to the rich man is the way he ignored the word of God coming through Moses and the prophets. How have the gospels, the scriptures or your faith opened you up to a deeper and more satisfying perspective on life?
- 3) Some people look to the spectacular for a sign of God's presence and action. For Jesus the lessons we need are not to be sought in the spectacular, but in the ordinary things of everyday life. Where have you found reminders of God's presence in the world around you?
- 4) 'An authentic faith – which is never comfortable or completely personal – always involves a deep desire to change the world, to transmit values, to leave this earth somehow better than we found it ... All Christians, their pastors included, are called to show concern for the building of a better world.' (Pope Francis, Evangelii gaudium, The Joy of the Gospel, No. 183)
