MISSION SUNDAY 2022

Some of the happy memories of my childhood are the many visits to my grandmother in Tullow. Our visit invariably meant a visit to her local Church of the Most Holy Rosary. There we would pray the rosary with her, light candles and she would tell us the stories of the various statues of the saints. She seemed familiar with their life's stories. On some visits we were fortunate to be there for Benediction when the large community of Brigidine Sisters and Patrician Brothers would process in unison into the church. It gave the sense of something very mysterious taking place. It was a wonderful occasion and my grandmother in her own simple but deep way explained the meaning of it to us. That memory is as fresh today as it was way back in the early 60's. My mother very much inherited her mother's faith and we, all nine of us, received the gift of faith and prayer from both my mother social outreach.

Pope Francis chose the following scripture for this year's **WORLD MISSION DAY**: "You shall be my witnesses to the ends of the earth." (Acts: 1: 8). A lady by the name of Blessed Pauline Jaricot inspired the celebration of the first **WORLD MISSION DAY** in 1926. She saw the need to pray for and to financially support all missionaries.

When we give to the Mission Collection this weekend we are enabling the many Irish religious and lay missionaries to continue the work of bringing the Good News of God's Love to all peoples. As the work of the "missions" progressed our missionaries gradually built schools, hospitals, health care facilities, set up universities, women's educational opportunities and helped train teachers and catechists for schools and parishes in the remotest of places. I suggest that we go to the websites of the Columban Sisters and Fathers: Kiltegan Fathers: Medical Missionaries of Mary: Mercy Sisters: Presentation Sisters: Loreto Sisters: Franciscan Sisters for Africa: Holy Rosary Sisters: Holy Ghost Fathers: Holy Faith Sisters: St. Joseph of Cluny Sisters: De La Salle Brothers and Christian Brothers. Here we'll find the enormity of their work. These men and women, alongside their lay associates, are working heroically and committedly to help give the disenfranchised, the poor, the excluded and the poorest – those without a voice – justice, hope, opportunities, dignity and new life. Their stories are uplifting, inspiring and powerful. Today we honour all of them on this **MISSION SUNDAY**.

Saint Mother Teresa said: "Charity isn't about pity. It's about love. Not all of us can do great things but we can do small things with great love. The fruit of love is service which is compassion in service." As Jesus got down on his knees to wash the feet of his disciples at the Last Supper, so too our Missionaries literally get down on their knees to serve the poor. Jesus asks all of us to do likewise. **Let us support our Missionaries in all their great work.**



WORLD MISSION SUNDAY – THIS WEEKEND

World Mission Sunday is the Holy Father's annual appeal for spiritual and financial support so that the life-giving work of overseas mission and missionaries can continue. It always falls on the second last Sunday in October, meaning this year it will be celebrated over the weekend **this Sunday, October 23**, and is co-ordinated in Ireland by Missio Ireland.

All offerings made on behalf of World Mission Sunday become part of the Holy Father's Universal Solidarity Fund. This fund supports missionary activities in over 1,100 young dioceses, mostly in Africa, Asia, and Latin America. As young dioceses grow, so do their needs. On top of this, they are often found in remote areas devastated by conflict or natural disasters. The Universal Solidarity Fund provides aid so that missionaries can continue to go to these places to share the love of God.

New Pilgrim Path: Website of the Week: The Song of Songs

The great mystic, St Teresa of Avila, said that in the Old Testament book, the 'Song of Songs', the Lord is teaching the soul how to pray. "Along how many paths, in how many ways, by how many methods you show us love! ...in this Song of Songs, you teach the soul what to say to you... We can make the Bride's prayer our own."

If Teresa is right and the loving, desiring, passionate language of the Song is the language in which God longs to hear the soul speak, many of us may have to make a radical shift in our perception of what it is to love and be loved by God. Why, from the hundreds of Old Testament passages used in readings for Sundays and Holy Days in the Catholic Lectionary, is not a single passage from the Song included? And only two passages used in the Revised Common Lectionary? Listen to – and pray with – this tremendous hymn of praise, stunningly read by David Suchet (the actor who played Poirot), at www.newpilgrimpath.ie.
